## ANNUAL REPORT ON NSS FOR THE YEAR 2016-17 (April 1st 2016 to March 31st 2017)

This academic year saw varied and vibrant activities on the part of NSS units in the campus. NSS began this year's activities by celebrating World Environment Day on 5th June by planting trees and taking oath to preserve and protect wildlife and nature. A counselling and motivation class was organised by NSS with the assistance of Women's Cell to our girl's students. NSS observed important days of the year in the campus by different programmes by the volunteers. These include World Environmental Day, Reading Day, Teachers Day, Literary Week, NSS Day, Gandhi Jayanthi, Children's Day, Malayalam New Year Day, World Aids Day etc. As part of "Sadbhavana Day" NSS organised awareness classes, cleaning programmes, poster exhibitions and sanitation drive. A pre-marital counselling class was organised by NSS to the students. The students expressed satisfaction in the class by Dr. Girish Kumar. At the time of children's Day NSS honoured an eight year old school boy who won an LSS scholarship. NSS started a programme titled 'Kunjatta' to distribute child magazines and books of tales to Anganyadi and nursery children. Trained NSS volunteers took the duty of online registration of the names of adults in the voters list. This work has been performing for a period of last 4 years. This year NSS flagship programme was organising various activities in the adopted colony: Vadayam Kandy Colony- a poor pottery making colony in Kunnummal Panchayath. NSS organised a free medical camp in the colony with the support of Malabar Hospital, Calicut intended to boost the health awareness of the people and to make a free check-up of their health.
